Family Ministries

When you hear the word "hospitality", what come to mind? We typically understand hospitality as a willingness to host, feed, and entertain a guest ... something we all do and especially with our personal friends. However, what if the biblical term has a much deeper (and more difficult) meaning? The Greek term that is often translated into the English term "hospitality" is a combination of two concepts, which break down as follows:

1. **(Philao)** is one of several words for "love" in Greek. It means "brotherly love" or "to love like a brother," and is how we get the name Philadelphia — the City of Brotherly Love.

2. **(Xenos)** makes up the second half of the word and it means "stranger" or "immigrant".

In light of these two words being combined, hospitality as commonly understood, isn't exactly the best way to express this biblical truth. Instead of simply "entertaining guests" the word becomes "one who loves strangers/immigrants, like you would your

own brother." That's a big difference, and completely changes the way we see this term used in scripture. Romans 12:9-21, list the marks of a true Christian. One of those marks is found in verse 13, where we are told to practice hospitality; brotherly love to strangers. Titus 1:8 and 1 Timothy **3:2**, commands that leaders of the church "...must be hospitable". The command to be hospitable is not "entertaining" friends and family. It is a command to love and treat strangers/immigrants like brothers and sisters. This is more than just a onetime event. This kind of love should be a part of our daily lives: the kind of love that we practice as we interact with strangers: in our cars, walking down the street, in stores and restaurants, in classrooms. Hard truth. Inconvenient truth. Truth that's difficult to follow, even for me. Let's hold one another accountable to love in this radical way, as we prove our love for Christ through Biblical Hospitality.
