Annie S. Hawks, a wife and a mother of three from Brooklyn, New York, loved writing poetry. In the 1870's while attending Dr. Robert Lowry's Hanson Place Baptist Church (wow what a church name), she was encouraged by Dr. Lowry to begin writing Sunday school songs for children. "I need Thee Every Hour" was written on a bright June morning in 1872. Annie later wrote, "One day as a young wife and mother of 37 years of age, I was busy with my regular household task. Suddenly, I became so filled with the sense of nearness to the Master that, wondering how one could live without Him, either in joy or pain, these words, 'I Need Thee Every Hour,' were ushered into my mind, the thought at once taking full possession of me."

The next Sunday, Annie handed these words to Dr. Lowry, who wrote the tune and chorus while seated at the little organ in the living room of his Brooklyn parsonage. Later that year, it was sung for the first time at the National Baptist Sunday School Association meeting in Cincinnati, Ohio, and published in a hymnbook the following year.

After the passing of her husband sixteen years later, she testified that she found great comfort in the words of her song. She wrote, "I did not understand at first why this hymn had touched the great throbbing heart of humanity. It was not until long after, when the shadow fell over my way, the shadow of great loss, that I understood something of the comforting power in the words which I had been permitted to give out to others in my hour of sweet serenity and peace." Thanks to her Holy Spirit inspired words, we are reminded that there is not an hour of the day that we do not need our God. In the kitchen of our homes, the office of our employment, the fields of our labor, we need Him. We need Him in our schools, our courtrooms, our hospitals and on the street corners of our lives; in our marriages, in our parenting, our friendships and churches; in our beginning and at the graveside, yes we need Him. Take time to confess with all your heart: "I need Thee every hour, Most gracious Lord; No tender voice like Thine can peace afford, I need Thee, O I need thee; Every hour I need Thee; O bless me now, my Savior, I come to Thee!"
