Vacation Bible School Update

Spark Studios Vacation Bible School 2022 has come to a close. The children have learned that they are "God's workmanship created in Christ Jesus, for good works which God prepared ahead of time for them to do". Ephesians 2:10 They have learned that each one of them is uniquely and wonderfully made. We had 145 children enrolled with an average attendance of 132. There were 130 plus volunteers working together to make Vacation Bible School happen. You have heard it before, but Vacation Bible School simply does not happen without you. You are a very busy group of people, but when God calls this group of believers to do a job, you respond to Him by making VBS a priority. I'm thankful for the opportunity that you have given the children to learn more about Jesus. During the week 1092 meals were served along with a lot of snacks.


The Missions offering went to Grace Extended, missionaries from Lamar, Missouri who have been called to Northern India. They talked to the children all week about that calling and what India will be like. The children brought in \$1,089.97 and the offering during the closing worship rally was \$4,125.44 for a total of \$5,215.41. We are thankful to be able to support local missionaries!

This year VBS added adult classes that consisted of Bible study and parenting topics. The class ran from 7-25. It was well received and got some great reviews from those attending!

As the children heard the Bible lessons they learned about God the creator, God the designer, Jesus the King, Jesus the Redeemer and the Holy Spirit, the helper. As you prayed for the children and teachers 16 children expressed a desire to pray and trust Jesus to be their Lord and Savior. Our work is not finished, we will follow up with every child and continue to teach what it means to be a Christian.

It has been an amazing week and we say thank you to every single person who helped. What an amazing church family!
