July 3rd – A Divine Appointment

Dear First Family,

As the 5th year of Faith, Family, and Fireworks approaches, I think it is important for us to look back and remember what the entire purpose of this event is. Even though it is a fun day to bring your whole family out and celebrate freedom, we must not forget that this event is designed for outreach. There are going to be hundreds of people here that have not yet given their lives to Christ. My prayer is that each of us approach this event as a mission field.
