

"But as for you, teach what accords with sound doctrine." (**Titus 2:1**). Doctrine is the term we use to describe the core beliefs we share as followers of Christ, as revealed in Scripture. SO! IS sound doctrine important? DOSE it really make a difference what we believe? -Sound doctrine is important because the purpose our faith is based on a particular message. "Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures...He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures" (**1Corinthians 15:3-4**). If we stray from that particular message, we lose the purpose of our Faith.

Sound doctrine is important because what we believe affects what we do. True teaching, influenced by sound doctrine promotes righteousness; sin flourishes where sound doctrine is absent. What we believe SHOULD influence the way we live our lives and how we serve others. Show me a believer with sound doctrine and I will show you a believer with a servant heart. Please understand, we love not in word and talk but in deed and in truth (1John 3:18). What I am saying is, if you lack the "deed and truth" and your doctrine is "word and talk" alone, you probably have false doctrine or no doctrine at all!

Sound doctrine *reveals false teaching*. "Many false prophets have gone out into the world" **(1John 4:1)**. The best way to distinguish truth from falsehood is to know what the truth is, and we find that truth in God's Word.

Sound doctrine is important because *it encourages believers to love God for who He is*. When we know Who God is, His grace, mercy, power and love for us, we in turn, love Him more. When we search the Bible for the truth about Him, Sound doctrine will become our lighthouse in any storm we face **(Psalm 119:105)**. When we love God for Who He is we serve Him not because we have to, but because we love and want to. So yes, doctrine is important!
