Music / Family Ministry

Why Small Groups?

1. (**Discipleship**) Small groups provide opportunities for believers to learn from each other as they apply the gospel in their daily lives and relationships. (Titus 2:1–8)

2. (Study) When we discuss and apply Scripture together, we learn to understand not only the Bible, but also each other. The combination of a capable Bible teacher and eager learners, all exchanging ideas together, can be powerful.

3. (**Curiosity**) Small groups cultivate an environment of openness and trust, where group members are encouraged to ask questions they might not ask elsewhere.

4. (Accountability) Small groups encourage church accountability, in teaching and communal living (Titus 1:5–9). Every member should encourage and gently urge their brothers and sisters to better follow the Lord. (Matt. 18:15–20; Gal. 6:1–2)

5. (**Hospitality**) Hospitality, in the small group environment, is a natural way to practice the Biblical imperative of loving those to whom they have no natural bond. (Heb. 13:2, Rom. 12:13) In small groups, believers gather in homes for food and spiritual conversation, those present can witness hospitality blossoming from theory to practice.

6. (Prayer) In the New Testament believers prayed together "with one accord" (Acts 4:24). In small groups, children and parents, neighbors and friends, elders and new believers help each other approach to the throne of grace, articulating their praise and petitions in a more intimate way.

7. (Socializing) Small groups help us develop a greater sense of Christian community in a disconnected age. Small groups encourage deeper Christian friendships, encourage greater spiritual accountability among church members, and create opportunities for inviting the unbelieving, the unchurched, and under-churched, to interact with believers.

8. (Unique Environment) Small groups can never and should never replace Sunday morning worship, but they do create an environment that promotes intimacy. Small groups are informal by nature and allow for open discussion free from time restraints and social decorum. They are a place to laugh and cry together, share a meal and life together; a place to be honest and real with each other about our shared struggles and victories, and a place grow in our faith and understanding of our Lord and Savior.
